She uses her past as a tool to inspire and influence the youth community wherever she visits and encourages them to get back on track with their studies and education.

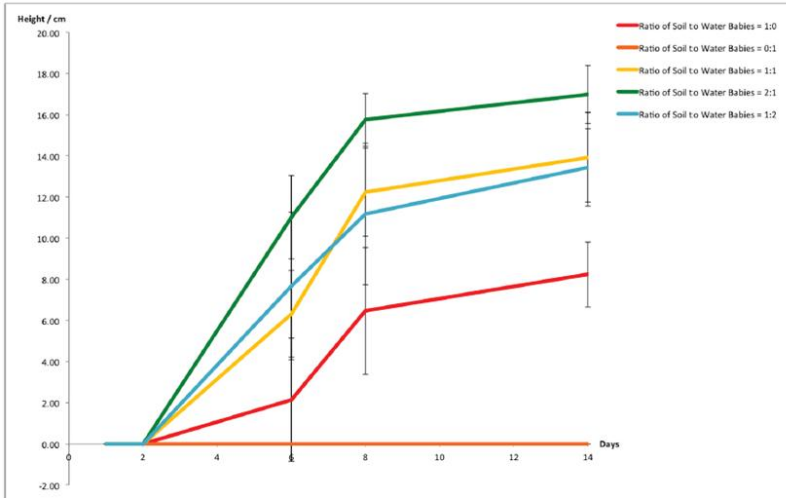

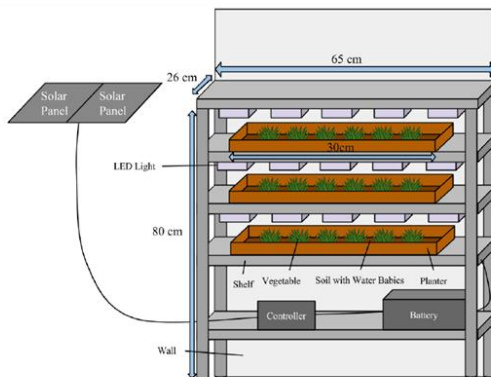

**Figure 1: Plants Grown in Soil System with Ratio of Soil to Water Babies of 2:1 had Greatest Average Height.** The data is based on the average height of 10 plants over 14 days for each set of data. The error bars represent  $\pm 1SD$ .



**Figure 2: Schematic drawing of the miniature vertical farm set up.** The set-up has a dimension of 60cm x 30cm x 90cm, with planters that are 40cm long placed on three of the shelves. 9 LED lights are connected to two solar panels by a controller and battery. The water/soil system consists of water babies and charcoal soil.



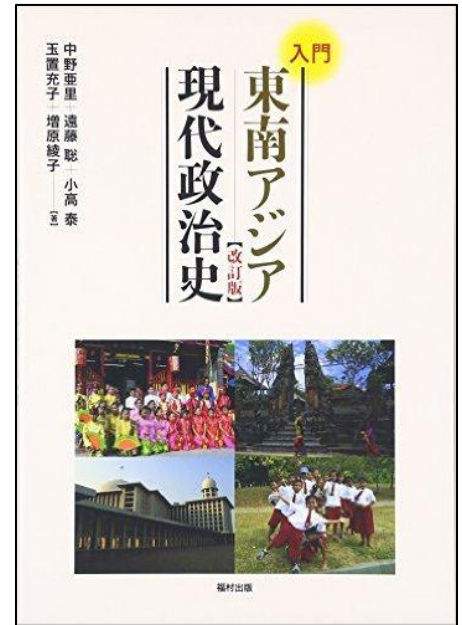
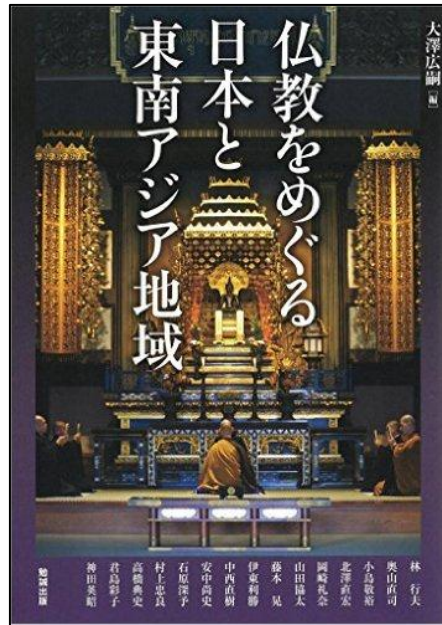
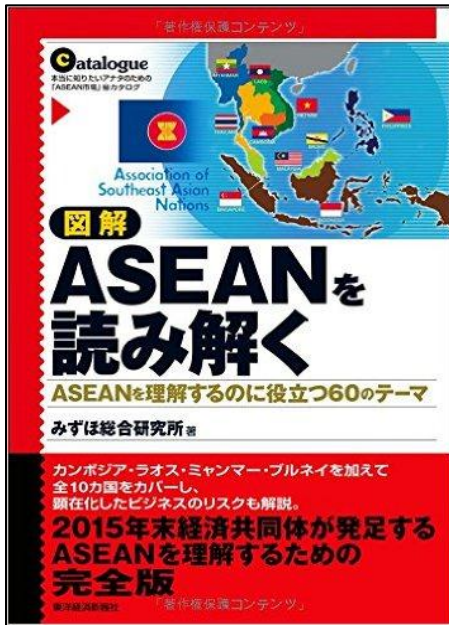
**Figure 3: Photograph of the miniature vertical farm set up.**
